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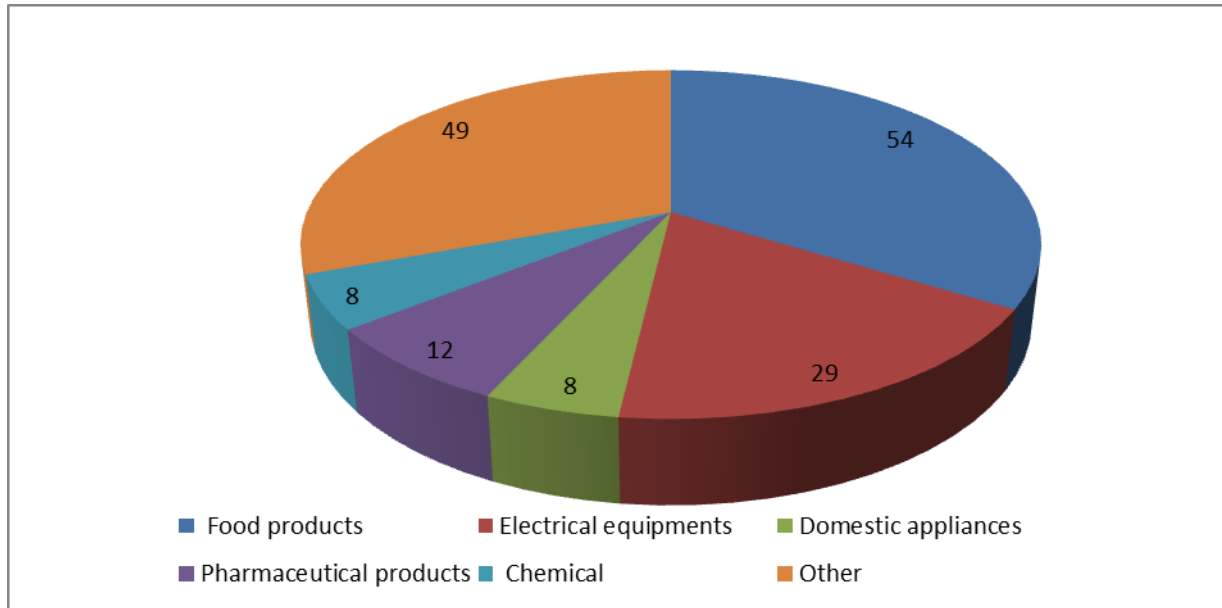

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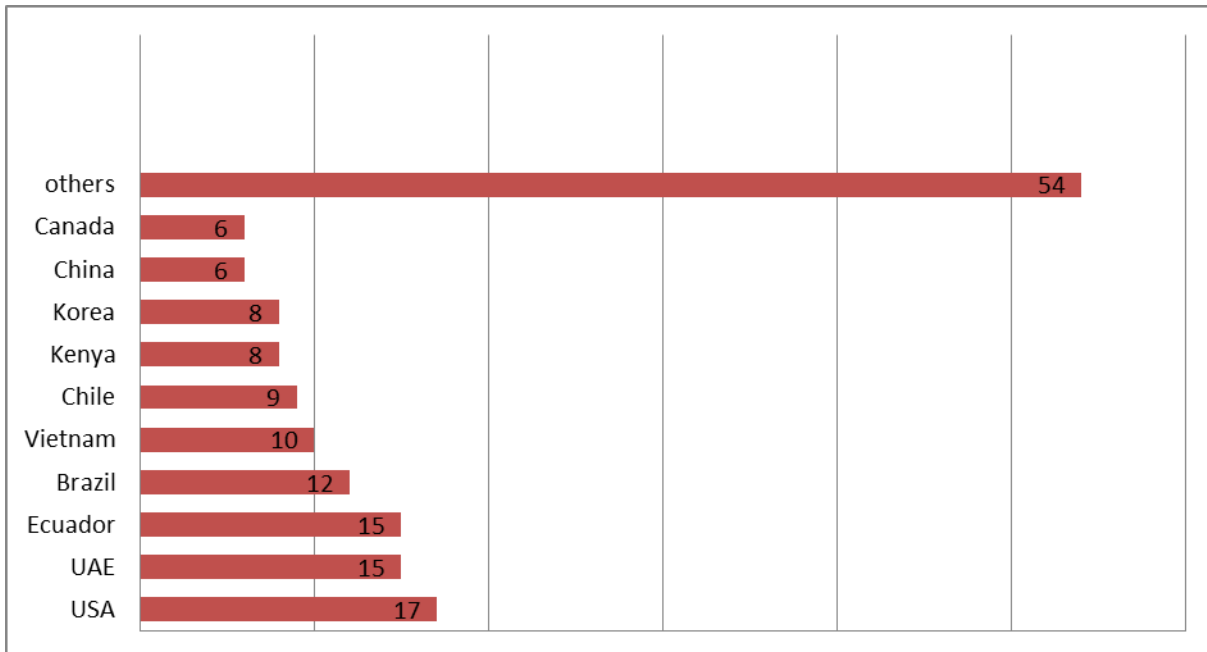
Monthly Report-June 2014

Notification Details:

The total numbers of TBT notifications issued by the various WTO-member countries in June 2014 were 160. Among these 160 notifications, 48 notifications were addendums that notified adoption of a regulation based on a notification issued earlier.

Product-wise Information: Out of the total 160 notifications 54 are related to food and food products , 29 related to electrical equipment,12 related to pharmaceuticals , 8 related to chemicals, 8 related to domestic appliances and the remaining 49 notifications were related to textiles, tobacco, toys, construction ,energy , footwear fuel , furniture, steel , medical mineral , safety device , cosmetics, chemicals, automobiles and animal products.

Country-wise Information: Out of the total 160 notifications, USA issued 17 notifications, 15 each by UAE and Ecuador, 12 by Brazil , 10 by Vietnam , 9 by Chile , 8 each by Kenya and Korea , 6 each by china and Canada. The remaining 54 notifications were from other WTO Member countries.

Request for relevant regulations/translated copies sent to the issuing countries:

We have sent request for regulations/translated copies for 35 notifications.

- a. We received responses from Ecuador, Israel, Korea, Kuwait, Costa Rica, Guatemala, and Honduras, UAE, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and Germany. So, a total of 12 responses were obtained.
- b. Out of these 12 responses, Countries like UAE, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and Germany provided us the copies of English version of the regulation.
- c. Other countries like Ecuador, Israel, Korea, Kuwait, Costa Rica, Guatemala, and Honduras has responded that they do not have an English version of regulation.
- d. In addition to this, Chile, china, Columbia, Egypt, Kenya, Philippines and Nicaragua has not yet responded to our request.

For example, the colour, font type, font size, position and appearance of where the brand and variant name can be printed on tobacco products will be set out in regulations.
